Demonstration: Experimenting with Yupo Paper by <u>Julie Cline</u>

Materials List - if you choose to experiment too. (i'll email the list & info as well.)

- -Yupo Paper 3 pieces 11x 14 or 16 x 20 is better, one piece can be 8/5 x 11
- -3 colors of watercolor paints in spray bottles; 2 colors from the same side of the color wheel and a complementary color from the opposite side (you may apply watercolor with brushes if you don't have spray bottles)
- -Spray bottle full of clean water
- -Rags or paper towels on hand for drips and splotches
- -<u>1/4 cup clean cat litter</u>
- -Cotton string or embroidery thread (something that absorbs water, will lie flat and is flexible)
- -Manilla file folder or piece of card stock (light, stiff cardboard-like, easy to cut, but not paper thin)
- -<u>Found objects with interesting shapes and textures</u>; for example: rubber bands, shoe treads, tools, scissors, bolts, expired credit cards, kitchen utensils; (keep in mind you will be setting these down in wet, watercolor paint)

Optional: A light box or a piece of plexiglass on short stilts with a flashlight undeneath. (something that will be stable if you put the yupo down on top. The idea is for the light to shine upright through the yupo—to help you trace a drawing onto the yupo. You may also just watch this part of the demo.

Optional: Krylon Low-odor, clear matte finish- for sealing the project, so you don't have to get this.


