

March 2020 Meeting

Hands-on Demonstration - Mosiac Framed Art

Please join Laurie and the other EVA members to learn about creating art through the use of mosaics. At the end of the class, you will have an abstract glass mosaic framed piece of art. The technique you will learn will allow you to create other glass mosaic items such as stepping stones and garden planters.

Laurie Yaksick has been crafting mosaics using glass and tile for over 15 years. Her passion is making beautiful hand crafted mosaic pieces for the home and garden.

All materials will be provided:

- Stained glass: each table will have an assortment of pre-cut glass in different shapes & colors
- Metal frames: 5"x5" or 4"x6" in assorted colors
 Make sure to arrive on time to get the frame of your choice
- Assembly supplies: glue, grout, gloves, etc.

All are welcome to attend and watch. For those that will be participating, it is recommended to wear clothes that can get dirty. We will provide aprons as well. Even though the projects are small, grouting pieces can be a messy process.

February 2020 - Featured Artist Elena Mukhina Rumyantseva

Thank you so much to Elena for participating at our February meeting and providing a great demonstration!
The EVA members enjoyed learning her mixed media collage technique to create unique works of art.







Elena's process:

- She always starts with a detailed sketch. Then she makes several photocopies of the sketch because she will cut out each shape and use it as a template for cutting the leather pieces.
- She spends at least an hour going through her materials, thinking about color and value, before selecting which will be used for the piece. Sometimes the back of the fabric is a better color to use in the composition.
- Once the leather pieces are selected, she glues the cutout sketch pieces to the leather pieces using a glue stick. This works best if there is a smooth side to the material (i.e., it doesn't work very well on a furry surface). Then Elana carefully cuts out the shapes using either a Xacto knife or small, sharp scissors that cut all the way to the tip.
- Using real leather is ideal as opposed to faux leather or other material as it is less likely to change shape/curl over time.
- To attach the pieces to the final card, she uses E6000 glue or super glue.
- She also uses clear thread to sew on things like beads or buttons. But it would help if you were cautious about this because some clear thread will yellow over time.
- Elena uses tiny, strong magnets to keep the cards shut.
- For gluing on Swarovski crystals, she made a tool comprised of a wooden skewer with some tacky material attached to the end.
- Remember to lift up your work vertically periodically as you work because the colors can look different when they are hanging on a wall vs. sitting on a tabletop.
- Elena waits several months before selling a card to ensure the materials she's glued down do not start to peel off from the surface.
- She sells her work through her Facebook page or through Fabmo boutiques.









Favorite products:

- Fabric materials Leather, fabric remnants sourced through Fabmo.org
- E6000 glue it doesn't stiffen the material if you decide to remove it later
- Sharp cutting instruments Xacto and Fiskars scissors





About Fabmo.org:

Fabmo.org - a great organization that collects designer fabric remnants and shares it with people in exchange for a donation. You need to make an appointment, and she suggests getting there early because the good stuff goes fast. Elena mostly uses leather and papers made from natural fibers. Leather can be hard to come by since it's not the primary material Fabmo usually offers.

Are you up for this mission? We bet you are!






Judi Sherwood

Preschoolers Join Us in the Winter Challenge



EVA was very excited to share the Winter challenge with the preschoolers attending Foothill Church's Preschool. Shelly and Julie draped bright blue shopping bags over cardboard boxes. We encouraged nineteen 3 and 4-year old students to attack all four sides and the bottom of the bags with spots, dots, and polka dots. A few of the children were reserved at first—one even looked at the blank side of her bag and said, "I'm afraid." After some tentative starts, the kids finally let loose.

The bags were quickly covered in all sizes, shapes, colors of spots and dots, some of which expanded to engulf the entire side of the bag. One little girl actually managed to mix colors to make silver. The other children at her table immediately wanted to use the silver color, but since she had mixed it by accident and couldn't remember how she did it, she wasn't able to help them.







Miraculously, no clothes were ruined, though one sponge was sacrificed to cleaning black tennis shoe tracks off the floor, and several children went through the rest of the day with paint rings around their fingernails.

Once all the painting was finished, the children said "thank you", of course prompted by their teachers. Then they asked when the artists were coming back for another project. That question was spontaneous and the absolute best compliment EVA could have received. You can see the children's work on display in the church lobby with EVA's Spots, Dots, and Polka Dots exhibit.

The children will be flipping clay flower pots upside down and inserting bare branches in the drain holes to make trees.

Please consider donating branches, rocks, and/or flower pots.

- Branches: sticks will have to be fairly slim to fit into the flower pot drain holes & scaled for a preschooler-sized wilderness
- Rocks/stones: stones that are fist-sized and larger, but nothing that weighs more than a Plein air easel!
- Flower pots: again these need to be preschooler-sized but large enough to support the branches; 8" 12" pots
