Olive Hyde Art Guild is now accepting entries for the Holiday for the Arts Gala, Show & Sale, October 21-23, 2022

The show opens with a ticketed Gala on Friday night featuring hors d'oeuvres, sweets, and wine, with the first viewing and sale of art.

On Saturday and Sunday, the show is open to the public without charge. Each year we sell over \$25,000 of high-quality handcrafted objects and fine art.

All aspects of the show, including sales, are handled by Guild members. Artists do not need to be present at the event.

Media: Ceramics & glass, paintings, jewelry, fiber art, wood products, sculpture, and holiday goods.

Image samples of new artists' work will be screened online at the OHAG website. Artists submit 2-3 digital images using the online form at OliveHydeArtGuild.org.



The deadline for returning artists is August 15th. The application deadline for new artists or returing artisits who want to sell in a new category or different price point is July 7th.

A chance to disply your art locally

"The Coffee Cup" a favorite local coffee shop, has moved to a larger location (off Toyon) and they would LOVE to display our artwork. They have one large wall about 10-13 feet that is all ours for the filling. Sloane is planning either a rotating theme or rotating artist every three months. The main parameters are its 2D only at this time and ALL pieces must be able to hang with ONLY 3M hanging strips, that means large pieces must have no glass.

This is an exciting opportunity and the art will probably rotate quarterly as we do the church lobby. Of course not all work has to be for sale, all are welcome to participate. Sloane hopes to move the purple pieces to the coffee cup unless she has an interested artist who's ready to display now.
