March Demonstration

Demonstrator: Stephanie Metz. Strephanie will be demonstrating sculptural needle felting: creating three-dimensional, solid forms by poking at loose fluffy wool with specialized needles.

Stephanie Metz's innovative work in felted wool fuses sharp wit, thoughtful observation and careful craftsmanship in an unusual material to blur the line between art and science, natural and unnatural, organic and man-made.

Stephanie Metz was raised in the California Bay Area and received her BFA from the University of Oregon; she lives with her techie husband and two sons in San Jose. In January 2020 she debuted her first solo museum show *Stephanie Metz: InTouch* at the de Saisset Museum at Santa Clara University. She has been featured in San Jose's Content Magazine, Adobe Inspire Magazine, American Craft and 500 Felt Objects. Her work has been exhibited across the U.S. and internationally. Awards include grants from the Belle Foundation for Cultural Development, the Center for Cultural Innovation, and in 2015 she was honored as an Artist Laureate by SV Creates. She has



taught at Penland School of Crafts in North Carolina and Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts in Tennessee.

Stephanie states, "I use the unusual material of felted wool to create sculpture reminiscent of biological specimens: a sampling of notable, mysterious objects collected and presented as items of wonder. My sculptural forms borrow from anatomy, blending and sampling from soft, weighty folds of flesh, clean-cut architecture of bone, complex systems of plant growth, and the precise geometry of seed pods and cocoons. From far away my sculptures appear hard, smooth, and cold like marble, but closer observation reveals the opposite: a visibly soft, warm, textured surface. With my art I aim to provoke surprise, fascination, curiosity, and engagement-- the phenomenon of wonder".




